
## PARK COUNTY COMMUNITY SUPPORT TEAM




#### **METHODOLODY**

**Step 1:** Figured out what areas and which groups were the most impacted.

**Step 2:** Knocked on 217 doors of businesses and homes.

**Step 3:** Had 258 unique, open-ended, confidential, voluntary conversations asking questions such as "How are you doing?" and "What was your flood experience?"


